## AIM-AHEAD *All of Us* Training Program Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ):

Answer
An Early Stage Investigator is a Program     Director/Principal Investigator who has completed     their terminal research degree or end of postgraduate     clinical training, whichever is later, within the past 10     years and who has not previously competed     successfully as a PD/PI for a substantial NIH     independent research award. 2. This is an 8-month program requiring
approximately 8 hours per week
3. US citizens, non-citizen naturals, and permanent residents are eligible to apply for this program.
4. You are encouraged to apply. Please note that if you are an awardee for another AIM-AHEAD program, you will <b>not</b> be eligible to receive a stipend from this training program.
5. You are encouraged to apply. As an AIM-AHEAD funded researcher, you may not receive a stipend from this training program.
6. There is a minimum requirement of a bachelor's degree from an accredited U.S. institution. You are eligible to apply if you hold a degree from a U.S. institution and if you meet other criteria.
7. You are encouraged to apply; as faculty you don't need a letter of support/recommendation.
8. Many US institutions have already established data use agreements with <i>All of Us</i> (list: <a href="https://www.researchallofus.org/institutional-agreements/">https://www.researchallofus.org/institutional-agreements/</a> ).  If your institution does not yet have a DURA with <i>All of Us</i> it is important to start on that process quickly, so your access to those databases is not delayed. Begin

10. If I am unable to obtain a DURA from my institution, will I still be eligible for the program?	10. You will not have access to Controlled Tier Data without a DURA. If your institution does not currently have a DURA with <i>All of Us</i> (check Registered Institutions at <a href="https://www.researchallofus.org/institutional-agreements/">https://www.researchallofus.org/institutional-agreements/</a> ), the leads and instructors will assist you in the necessary steps for obtaining the DURA.
